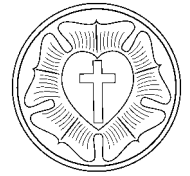

Holy Week

Holy Week is my favorite time of the year. We make our way from Jerusalem's gate to the temple to an upper room to Gethsemane to the courtyard of the high priest to the Praetorium and finally to Golgotha. We hear about a donkey, hosannas, a backroom deal, 30 pieces of silver, the Passover, a foot washing, bread and wine, body and blood, a hymn, a garden, a series of prayers, a kiss, a betrayal, a sword, a severed ear, false accusations, a slap, some spit, a whip, a scepter, a scarlet robe, a crown of thorns, a tunic, an agonizing walk, a place of the skull, three crosses, six excruciating hours, and seven final words. We meet followers, disciples, women, religious leaders, scoffers, plotters, a betrayer, a denier, high priests, a governor, a local king, soldiers, a murderer, two thieves, and a centurion. And there, in the center of it all is our Lord Jesus Christ!

He is what makes this week what it is: *Holy!* Holiness is what Jesus came to restore to fallen mankind. For there on the cross we see humanity in all of its unholiness. Look closely. Do you see it? There is Jesus, shouldering the weight of the world's sin. Your sin. The worst part of you. The part others see and the part you do your best to hide. It's all there on Jesus' shoulders. And what holds Him to the cross? Not the nails. Not really. As true God, He could have come down from the cross any moment He wanted. What holds Him to the cross is His love for you. For me. For the world. That's what makes this week my favorite time of the year. As a sinner, I need His forgiveness, His redemption, His salvation, His holiness. And so do you.

And then, after a brief Sabbath rest in the tomb, our Lord is raised victoriously from the dead to usher in His new creation. Sin, death, and hell have been defeated. The world has been reconciled. Sinners have been redeemed. Holiness has been restored. Now that's worth celebrating. For all of God's promises are fulfilled in Christ.

As you celebrate our Lord's resurrection this year, I ask you to ponder anew all that He has accomplished for you. Yes, I know, the list is endless. Forgiveness, life, and salvation are the crowned jewels of Easter. But behind those jewels are plenty of other gems as well. Consider the following. Because of Easter...

- ✓ the cherubim that once guarded the way to the Tree of Life have placed their flaming sword back into its sheath, that you, the sons of Adam and daughters of Eve, might return to God's Paradise;
- ✓ the One greater than Noah has emerged from the flood of God's wrath, that you, His people, might find rest and safety within the ark of His Church until He leads you at last to your heavenly Ararat;
- ✓ the Passover Lamb who was slaughtered that the angel of eternal death might pass over has been raised to new life, that you, His sheep, might forever be protected from that Satanic wolf;
- ✓ the hellish Pharaoh and his demonic army have been drowned in the Red Sea of Christ's death and resurrection, that you might pass through Holy Baptism into a new life and at last enter the Promised Land;
- ✓ the One stronger than Samson has pulled down the pillars of God's judgment upon sin, death, and the power of the devil, that you might be "strong in the Lord and in the power of His might" (Ephesians 6:10);
- ✓ great David's Greater Son has conquered that hellish Goliath by striking death itself in the forehead, that you might live before God in peace and quietness all the days of your life;
- ✓ the One greater than Jonah has come forth alive from three days in the belly of the earth, that you, the Ninevites, might hear and believe the good news that God is "gracious and merciful" (Jonah 4:2);
- ✓ the Temple that was destroyed by God's justice on Good Friday has been raised up, rebuilt, resurrected, that you might become a "temple of the Holy Spirit" and "glorify God in your body and in your spirit" (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

As the Holy Scriptures makes clear, Jesus is what makes this week Holy. Jesus is what makes you Holy. So have a blessed Holy Week, celebrating the victory and *holiness* He won for you on the cross and now gives you in Word and Sacrament. This truly is the best week of the year!

State of Divine Shepherd Lutheran Church

There have been some questions recently as to the financial state of our church. Given the tough economic times, some have feared the worst. However, thanks be to God, we are financially stable! All bills are current and paid in full when received. During our first month of the fiscal year (February) we had a surplus of \$356.22. Part of the surplus was an interest rebate check for our good loan status from LCEF. Our approved church budget has a scheduled loss, but we are confident that we will end the church year about even. We are on track for getting the mortgage paid on time or earlier. The mortgage interest rate went down 1% this year, which will help us to focus more on lowering the principal balance. All dedicated funds are held in a separate account and fully funded. We understand that times are tough, but please remember to continue supporting your church.

Our Little Lambs preschool is doing well. **Jolene Delaney** took over for Juli Thornton as an Assistant Teacher. Throughout the year we have been slowly adding students and now have almost a full class of 18. To help fill the class and to help the community we have started offering discounts to those in need on a limited basis. The program has been quite successful, and the preschool is hopeful it will at least break even by the end of the school year.

We have a beautiful new organ, which we purchased last year taking a loan in the amount of \$26,000. A friend of

the church loaned us the money at a low interest rate. We are current on the monthly payments of \$226. The organ payments have and will continue to be paid solely through our organ fund. The organ fund is scheduled to be paid-off in at most 10 years without the use of general church funds. Please continue to support this fund.

Kelly Stewart has recently joined the council, co-chairing the Board of Trustees with **Mel Meyer**. The trustees are currently planning renovations to the sanctuary, slated to start sometime after Easter. First, the sanctuary will be painted (paid for by an anonymous donor). Ladies Aid donated \$400 for the paint and renting of a lift. New carpet will be installed (paid by an anonymous donor). In the process, loose pews will be secured/repaired. The trustees are also looking into making some of the pews more accessible for those in wheelchairs or with walkers/canes. Please talk to Mel or Kelly if you can lend a hand!

Although times are tough, extra efforts must be made to keep an eye on the financial stability of our church. God has truly blessed our church and congregation. "Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 110:5).
